ARGENTINE BOERS PLIGHT.

Appeal to Farmers in the Union.

Cape Town. Thursday.

An appeal is made in the current issue of the Kerkbode by the Rev. A. D. Luckhoff, secretary to the Dutch Reformed Poor Relief Committee, to farmers in the Union to provide temporary board and lodging for the repatriated Argentine Afrikaners.

Mr. Luckhoff explains that it was originally intended to allow the no Agrentine family to come to South Africa until arrangements had been made for settling the family at some Government scheme. It was later found, however, that many of the Argentine families were in dire distress at Comodoro, Rivadavia, and it was thought that these people should be brought to South Africa immediately.

For this reason it was decided to appeal to South African farmers to provide these people with board and lodging until they could be moved to settlement schemes.

About 36 families, comprising 180 persons will need help of this type. They will sail from the Argentine next month,
